Concerns about climate change and cultural survival resulting from colonization have pushed Alaska to the forefront of global conversations. *Decolonizing Alaska* is a multi-media visual art exhibit that explores how 30 diverse contemporary Alaskan artists grapple with these issues and present new possibilities for cultural sustainability.
